

Diversity Data 2020

This diversity data has been collated in accordance with the BSB Handbook, Rules on Equality and Diversity (BSB Handbook).

123 members, staff and pupils were sent the survey to complete and of those 108 (88%) responded. Out of that total 3 respondents did not complete the form with any meaningful data. Of the complete responses 8 indicated that they did not consent to the collection of their anonymised data and so their data has been omitted from the following published data. A further 4 did not consent to their anonymised data being published in circumstances where they would be included in a pool of less than 10 members sharing one or more characteristics.

It follows that the numbers provided below will not always add up to the total number of responses and percentages will not always total 100%. For the same reasons some possible answers have been omitted entirely. Anonymity is the priority, where it has been requested, in accordance with BSB guidance.
